Science News

The capstone project for ninth grade Earth Systems is a Science Learning Project or SLP. This is introduced in the disclosure document in August and worked on during the next five months. It is due usually the first week of February which is part of third term. Each student has an option of picking on 5 different categories in which to do their project. The categories are science fair, scientific illustration, video documentary, multimedia presentation, and scientific collection. For most of these categories we have tried to offer a way for students to compete for fame, fortune, and glory. Science fair competes at the school, district, and region levels. The other categories compete at the school level only since there is not yet a venue beyond that. The top projects in the categories of scientific illustration and video documentary were able to be competitively judged by faculty this year. Due to Covid-19 we have not been able to determine winners in the final 2 categories. Usually, the multimedia presentations are judged by the students peers. The collection this year did not have enough participants to have a viable competition. We are extremely proud of all our students, and all of the hard work they put into their projects.


Scientific Illustration winners with pictures.
